received a "Thank You" letter from a Budget and Finance Committee member. I wanted to thank you for your patience during this pandemic with our staff and ministries. And we need you to extend that patience. We are aiming for July 5 as our first "public" worship gatherings in the sanctuary. We are in the planning stages now so we can be smart and safe as we reconvene. That said, I want to encourage you, if you are running a fever, coughing or sneezing, or at-risk from a health perspective or elderly, please stay home! We want you to be safe and to feel safe (there's a reason we call them "sanctuaries":)). If you're not comfortable coming out for worship yet, we do plan to continue livestreaming via Facebook and YouTube (with or without new equipment/installation—it will look a lot darker without). You may continue to join us online. Stay tuned for times. But you have another option too.

June 14...drive-in service at 8:30 AM

Beginning June 14, we will conduct our first

drive-in service at 8:30 AM on the east side of the children's wing. Please park in the gravel parking lot first. If you wish and the weather suits you are welcome to bring a bag chair and (once again), practicing physical distancing, sit outside and enjoy the service. The service will be abbreviated but will include singing, giving, and a message. We believe that a service

like this one might provide at-risk or older adults the opportunity to join us physically for worship even after the resumption of services in the sanctuary until a vaccine is developed.



# **Congregational Vote**

(Return your ballots

The following are recommendations from the Budget and Finance Committee. We were to vote on the first recommendation on March 29th but did not gather on campus for worship at that time. The second recommendation is for funds to continue video streaming worship services. FBC members should have received a letter earlier this week with ballot(s) enclosed. Please prayerfully consider these recommendations and return your ballot to the church office by June 10th. If you have questions about the issues, you may call Marvin Moss at (864) 923-8152 or Blake Harwell at (864) 923-5277.

At the conclusion of 2019, FBC had an "overage" of \$40,500. It is the recommendation of the Budget and Finance Committee to:

- 1. Send \$1,500 to United Ministries of Clinton.
- 2. Send \$1,500 to the Laurens Memorial Home.
- 3. Send \$1,000 to the Good Shepherd Free Medical Clinic.
- 4. Move \$36,500 to a designated Capital Improvement account for the future repairs of existing buildings. (The roof of the Family Life Center needs to be replaced for insurance reasons).

The Budget and Finance Committee recommends spending up \$41,850 to continue and improve video streaming worship services after public worship services reopen.
